TAPP para Familias Latinas Results

TAPP is a culturally-responsive intervention that works within existing school support systems to help meet equity goals and build partnerships between parents and teachers to solve students' behavioral and academic challenges.

STUDY FINDINGS

1 Latinx students whose parents and teachers participated in TAPP showed significant:



HOME

- Increases in social skills, prosocial behaviors and adaptive skills.
- Decreases in behavioral problems.



SCHOOL

- Increases in social and adaptive skills.
- Decreases in behavioral, attention and learning problems.

2 Parents of Latinx students rated TAPP as highly acceptable and culturally appropriate, and reported significant gains in:

- Problem-solving abilities.
- Quality interactions and improved communication with their child's teacher.
- Feelings of mutual support with their child's teacher.



In my case, it changed a lot because I started to relate more with teachers. We were seeing the same things.

3 Teachers of Latinx students rated TAPP as highly acceptable and reported significant gains in:

- Problem-solving abilities.
- Quality interactions and improved communication with Latinx parents.
- Effective use of positive behavioral strategies in the classroom.



I developed some of the strongest relationships with parents through TAPP. It was really powerful.

[The child] really grew in their confidence of being able to be independent and do what they needed to do.






