What is TAPP?

A way for **teachers and parents** to work together on concerns.

Benefits

Research shows that TAPP has led to:

- 1 Lasting **improvements in student behavior**.
- 2 More **learning and behavior success**.
- 3 Parents and teachers who are better able to support **positive student behaviors**.
- 4 **Stronger relationships** between families and schools.

What does participation involve?

- It involves being randomly assigned to participate in TAPP or school as usual.
- Complete **2 questionnaires** that will take about **45 minutes** each.

If you and your child are assigned to TAPP:

- You will also be asked to participate in **3-4 meetings** with a TAPP specialist and your child's teacher.
- You will receive up to **\$550** for participation.

If you and your child are assigned to School as Usual:

- You will not be asked to participate in TAPP meetings.
- Your child will continue school as usual.
- You will receive up to **\$200** for participation.
